Carnegie Library – This beautiful building was built in 1903 and contained thousands and thousands of books. The Carnegie Library was Santa Ana's main library building until it was replaced in 1960 by a new building.

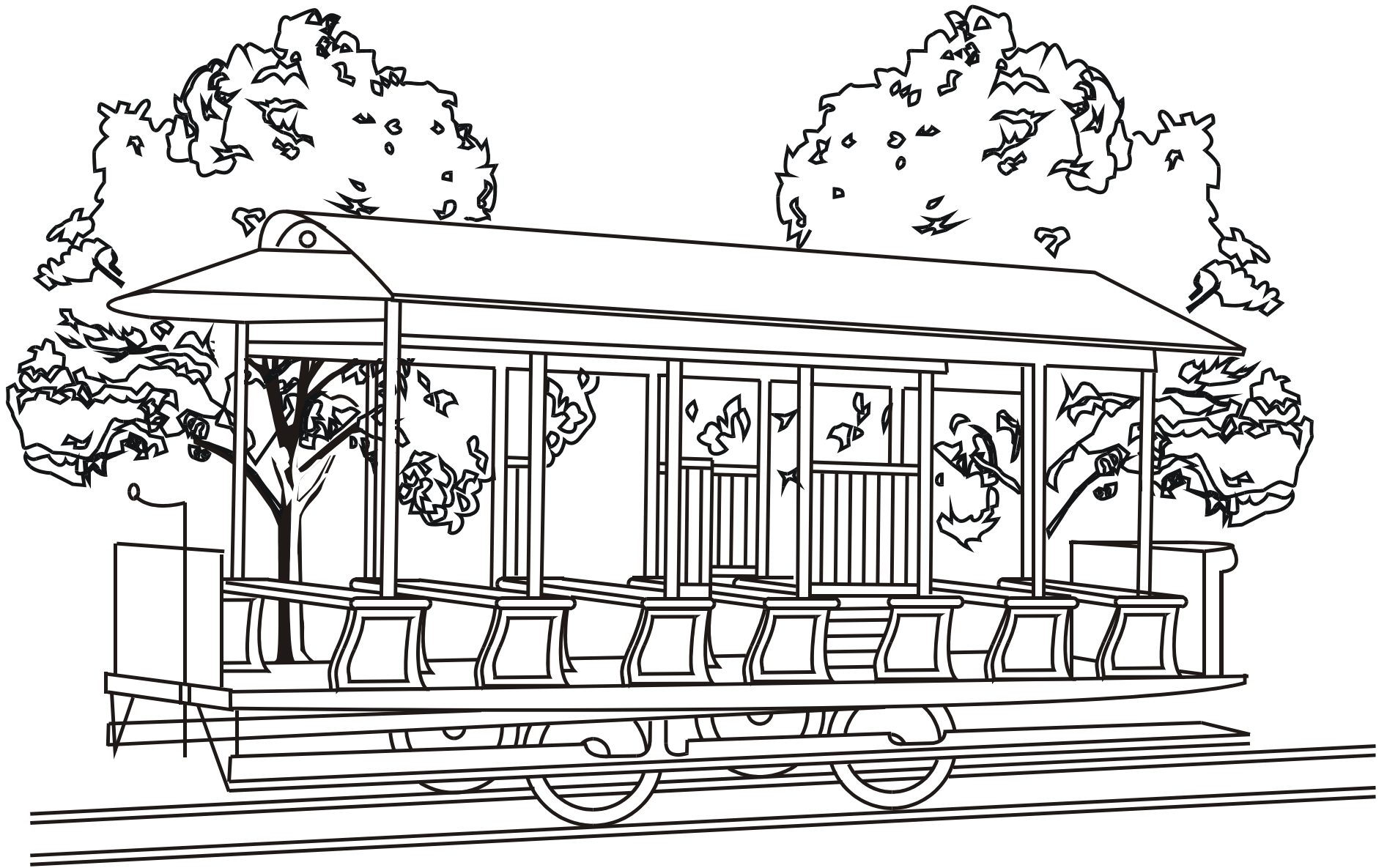

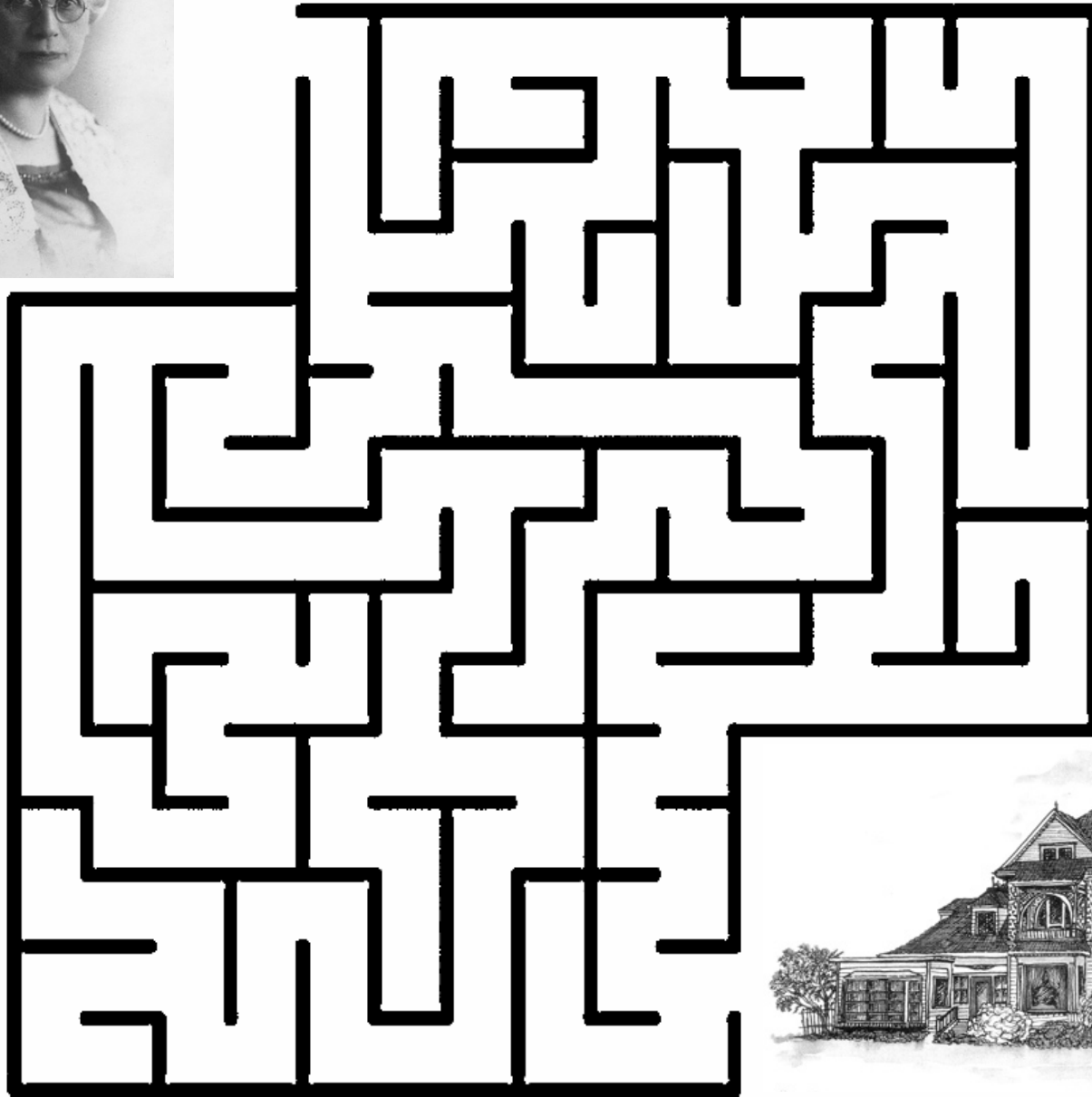

Trolley Car – This is a trolley car that was powered by a steam engine. It was used in the 1880s-1890s to take passengers from Santa Ana to Orange and to Tustin.

Old Orange County Courthouse – This beautiful building was built in 1901 and used as the courthouse for Orange County. It was replaced with a new building in 1968. This old courthouse was restored in 1987 and is used for some court cases and as a museum.

William Spurgeon Building – This office building is located in the heart of the downtown business district. It was built in 1913 by William Spurgeon, who was the founder of Santa Ana. The building has a working clock tower and chimes at different times through the day.

Dr. Willella Howe-Waffle House – This house was the original home and office of Santa Ana’s first female doctors – Dr. Willella Howe-Waffle. It was built in 1887. The house was moved to its new location at 120 Civic Center Dr. in 1974 and has been restored by the Santa Ana Historical Preservation Society to resemble when it was owned by “Dr. Willella,” as she was called.

Casa de la Dra. Willella Howe-Waffle – Esta casa fue la casa original y oficina de la primera doctora, Dr. Willella Howe-Waffle. Fue construída en 1887. La casa fue cambiada a su nueva localidad en el 120 Civic Center Dr. en 1974 y ha sido restaurada por la Sociedad de Preservación Histórica de Santa Ana para que se pareciera a la casa cuando la dueña era la Dr. Willella, como así le llamaban.

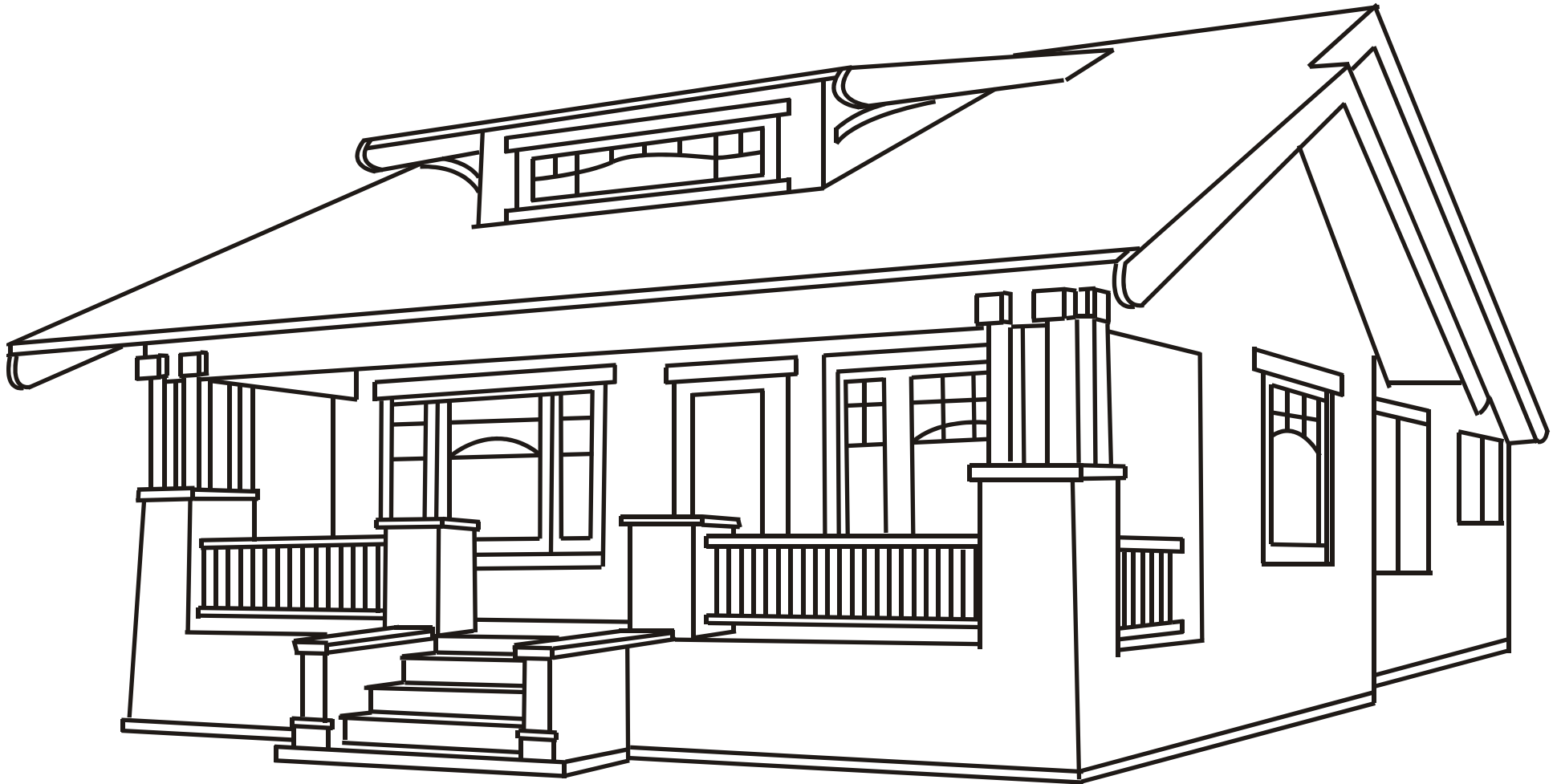

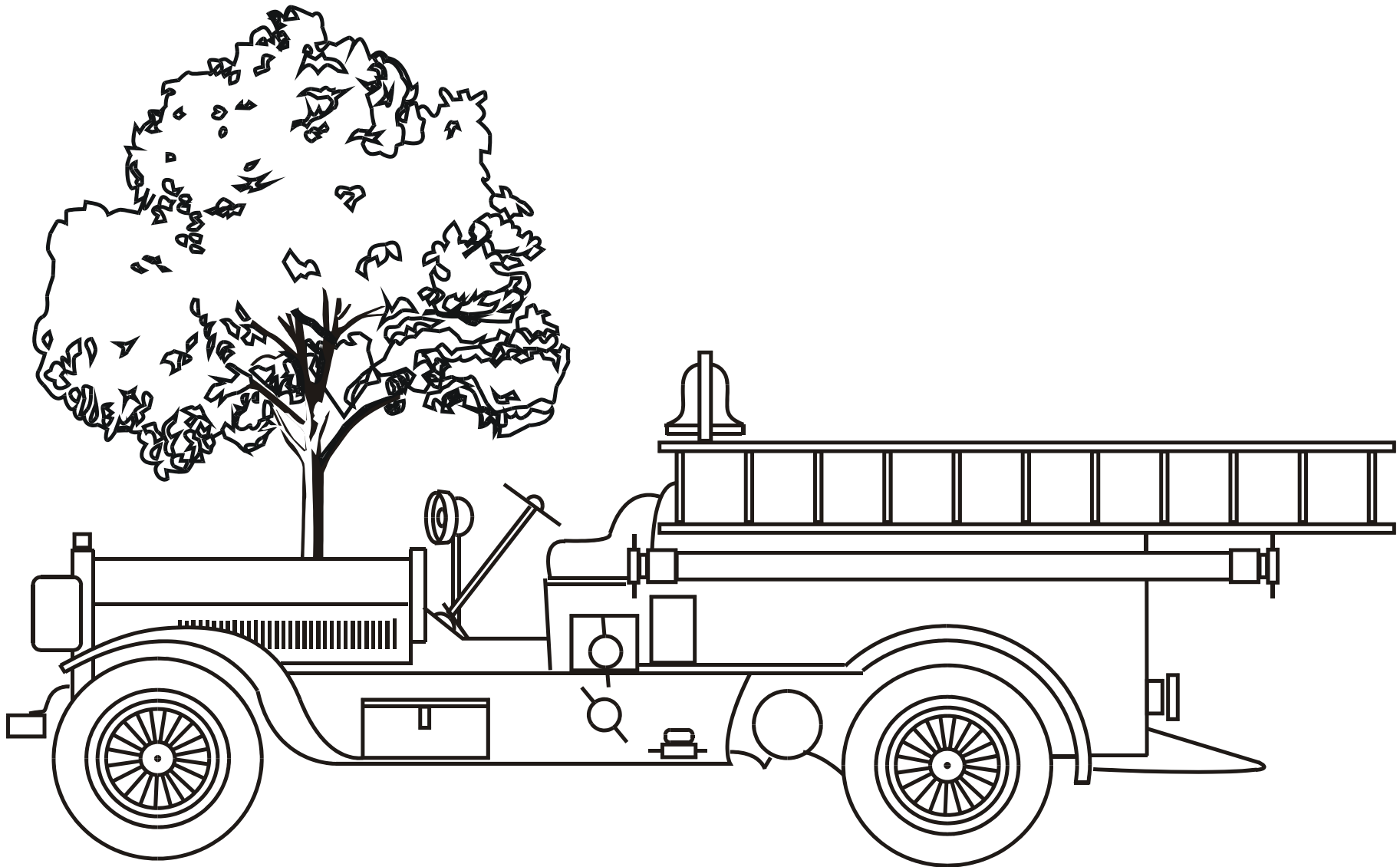
