- 2. Disregard any previous coordinate values from the July 5, 2004 survey that used a handheld Global Positioning System (GPS) unit.

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Notes for Magnolia Memorial Park Continued:

- 3. Datum: NAD83. Latitude and Longitude coordinates are in Degrees-Minutes-Seconds (DMS) format, +/- 1.00 feet of the grave location. Because of the high degree of accuracy of these coordinates, your handheld GPS receiver may not accept the full coordinate value listed here. Round up or down the "seconds" value to store the coordinates. The aerial photomap I compiled makes it pretty simple that you can really just walk to these graves by using the location map that was created.
- 4. Loving Coker is identified as being buried at Magnolia Memorial Park per the the Fullerton News dated February 16, 1905. The article says he was buried at Alamitos Cemetery. Alamitos Cemetery is the early name for Magnolia Memorial Park. Currently a descendant is making plans to install a grave marker between two other Coker graves. The proposed site was located during this survey on September 10, 2006.
