
As the new year begins, it is a time to review what the Santa Ana Historical Preservation Society accomplished in 1987 and to set goals for our organization for 1988.

Last year at this time, we were putting together the final plans for our Annual Dinner meeting set for January 20, 198/, at the Revere House. Mickey Welle arranged for the meal and Diann Marsh put together one of our best annual dinner programs, featuring a slide show about the Heninger Park Historic District. Susan Tully, President of the Heninger Park neighborhood council accepted a plaque honoring the impressive preservation efforts of her organization. Mr. and Mrs. Joe Robinson were honored for their successful restoration of the McAndrews Cottage on Civic Center Dr. Over 50 members and friends attended the 1987 annual meeting.

Early last year, Board member Diann Marsh also started our first series of quarterly newsletters. These newsletters enable our members and friends to keep up to date on S.A.H.P.S. activities and spotlight the progress of historic preservation in our city.

In July the Society provided a significant \$2500 loan to the Historic French Park Association to assist that organization in saving from demolition and restoring the Duggan House, which was moved to Lacy Street in September. The Santa Ana Historic Preservation Society is pleased to help our sister non-profit organization in their good work.

Society Vice-President Royal Spurrier organized a fantastic ice cream social for members and friends in August. A Dixieland style band and tours of the Dr. Howe-Waffle House were highlights of the afternoon. We look forward to another great get-together next summer.

Beginning in September, Society members began opening the Howe-Waffle House on the 3rd Saturday of each month on a trial basis. The experiment was successful and we plan to resume the Saturday open house after the house tour is over.

On November 12, 1987, S.A.H.P.S. was pleased to join several other local historical organizations in helping Orange County Board of Supervisors' Chairman Roger Stanton celebrate the rededication and completion of the significant restoration work on the Historic Orange County Courthouse. S.A.H. P. S. founder, Adeline Walker, was instrumental in placing the Courthouse on the National Register of Historic Places.

On December 10, the Society held its second annual Victorian Christmas Open House. Thanks to all of the board members, especially Glory Allender, the event was even bigger and better than last year's marvelous event. If you attended our Victorian Christmas, you know how wonderful it was. If you didn't, you should definitely plan to attend in 1988.

As we look ahead to 1988, our first big event will be our annual membership dinner meeting. It will be held on Friday evening, February 12th at A Special Touch Banquet Room. These are the same talented people who catered our Victorian Christmas. Mark your calendars and plan to attend. We look forward to another great evening of fellowship with all of you. #### Historic Preservation

Historic Preservation in Santa Ana—what's the next step? Santa Ana has many of the finest historic homes and buildings in Orange County within its borders. Some are listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Santa Ana Historic Register, the Santa Ana Historic Survey, the Heninger Park Historic Survey, or the Downtown Historic District list. The City Planning Department has recently photographed each house in the Wilshire Square neighborhood. The Housing Services Division has been very involved with historic homes through their loan program.

Local historic preservationists agree that all of these fine efforts need to be pulled together into a formalized Historic Preservation Element, designed especially for the city of Santa Ana. Linda Hale, from the City Planning Department, recently gave a presentation to the Cultural Heritage Committee, updating those present as to the status of historic preservation in our city. She stated that she had been instructed by June Catalano, Director of Planning and Building, to prepare a draft element. She said the element would include a plan for a City-Council-appointed Historic Preservation Advisory Board. The members of the committee will be preparing a list of items that they would like to see included in the element at their next meeting.

The general membership of S.A.N.E.(Santa Ana Neighbors for Excellence) recently voted unanimously to write a letter to the City Council asking that a Historic Preservation Advisory Board, with a neighborhood emphasis, be formalized.

#### **Duggan House**


