

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

So far, 1986 has been a busy year for the Santa Ana Historical Preservation Society, and much more activity is planned for the balance of the year. In January, we held our annual membership meeting at the Revere House. February brought several volunteers together one Saturday for a major pre-spring cleaning of the Howe-Waffle House. On Arbor Day, March 7, the County Board of Supervisors and Santa Ana City Council honored the memory of our founder, Adeline Walker, with the dedication of Orange County's official tree and a bronze plaque near the Howe-Waffle House gazebo. In April, we had some new wrought iron fencing installed around the house and carriage barn. Several volunteers put up new curtains in a number of windows in the house in May. In June, the offices of Orange County Centennial Inc. were established in the doctor's office and back sitting room of the Howe-Waffle House, and the Centennial Committee of the Orange Couty Historical Society convened for an evening meeting in our historic house. We are especially pleased to host these good organizations planning for the celebration of Orange County's Centennial in 1989, as 1989 also marks the centennial of the Howe-Waffle House.

In July, additional electrical outlets were placed in the house to accommodate the O. C. Centennial Inc. offices and to better prepare the house to host social functions. In August, the county, through a 1984 revenue sharing grant, spearheaded by Supervisor Roger Stanton, reimbursed the society for the cost of insuring the organization's furnishings in the Howe-Waffle House. The society also received on loan the marvelous

letter and present the honorees with their award at our annual dinner in January. We believe strongly in the future of our neighborhoods and want to show our appreciation to the urban pioneers who are living in and restoring historic homes and buildings.

McANDREWS COTTAGE AND CARRIAGE HOUSE

509 Civic Center Drive

Joe Robinson is our first architectural awards winner. He is responsible for the beautiful restoration of the McAndrews cottage and carriage house at 509 Civic Center Drive. Those of us who saw the buildings last year, after they had been condemned by Santa Ana code enforcement, were shocked at the condition of the house. Mr. Robinson saw the potential of the building and spent last summer completely rehabilitating it. The house now boasts a coat of grey paint with white trim, has a new portico, a brick wainscot along the front, and new latticework fencing. It has been completely renovated on the interior and has a complete new kitchen and bathrooms. The grey and white color scheme has been carried inside and includes light grey walls and carpeting with the original woodwork painted a sparkling white. The carriage house has been rehabilitated to match, and has a separate rental unit on the second floor.

Congratulations to Mr. Robinson for his vision and his ability to complete such a tasteful restoration project.



HARMON-McNEIL HOUSE

On October 28th, the Harmon-McNeil House, in two sections, made its way west on Chestnut, north on Main Street, east on Ninth, and south on Lacy, to its new home on Lacy, between Vance and Civic Center Drive. The house, once owned and partially restored by Cecil Warren, will be placed on a foundation, painted and reroofed before it is offered for sale by the City of Santa Ana. The house, including the interior plaster, withstood the move very well. a group of about 20 old house people walked along with the building and had champagne at Fraunfelder's, at about 3 a.m. Anyone interested in buying and restoring this spectacular historic house

ROSS-McNEAL HOUSE


1020 North Baker

Built in 1879, the Ross-McNeal House was constructed for Elizabeth Ross, the wife of Jacob Ross Sr. The Ross family sold the land on which Santa Ana was originally founded to William Spurgeon in 1869. This fine home is still in the family and is being restored as a four unit apartment by Fred McNeal, a descendant of the original Ross and McNeal pioneer families. FRENCH PARK ASSOCIATION

Five years ago the French Park neighborhood became Santa Ana's first historic district and received its specific plan. David and Jean Fraunfelder were instrumental in organizing the neighborhood to go to city council and request the historic designation and plan. At the time, they were presenting a daring idea: downzone the area and encourage restoration of the existing houses. After five years of implementation, it is obvious to all that the plan is a big success. Historic French Park is getting better and better.



BALL HOUSE

The Dr. Ball House has at last shed its coat of gold stucco, as part of the restoration process. Located at 1119 North Bush Street, in the Historic French Park neighborhood, the house is being rehabbed as office space by Leon Roach and Gary Hadsdell. The old roof had been stripped off and the interior gutted in preparation for a new use and a new life. Because the Ball House has been vacant for four years, everyone is relieved to see the boards come off the windows and the rehabilitation started. We would like to commend Mr. Roach and Mr. Hadsdell for their efforts.
